The Hardy Lectureship was founded in 1967 in memory of G.H. Hardy in recognition of outstanding contribution to both mathematics and to the Society. The Hardy Lectureship is a lecture tour of the UK by a mathematician with a high reputation in research.

The 2018 LMS Hardy Fellow is **Professor Lauren Williams** (UC Berkeley). Professor Williams' research is highly interdisciplinary and has had a broad impact on several areas of Mathematics, ranging from combinatorics and algebra to probability and mathematical physics, with applications to particle processes and shallow water waves.

Lauren Williams will visit the UK in June and July 2018 and she will give talks in: London **29 June**; Oxford **2 July**; Cambridge **3 July**; Kent **5 July**; Edinburgh **9 July**; Leeds **10 July** and Birmingham **11 July**.
